Font in **BLUE** is not stipulated under the Rules of Golf, but should help the player track their scoring.

Font in **GREY** was simply to show the MARKER and Players B and C scores, although as the card relates to Player A, scores for other players played during the round are not required.

This simply helps the Committee identify the purpose of the card. If the card is for a General Play round (for handicapping), then "General Play" can be used. If it to be used for calculating a Player's Initial Handicap, "For Handicap" could be used.

Date

This is important so that the round is input in the correct sequence within a Player's Scoring History on their Handicap Record.

Tees Played

This is important as it will ensure the correct handicap parameters (Course Rating and Slope) are used in the Player's handicap calculation.

Player Names

When cards are submitted for handicap / competitions, there should be one card for each player. It will be assumed the card will belong to PLAYER A, unless clearly stated otherwise.

Each score must also have a MARKER, who should be a responsible person (normally a fellow competitor if playing in a competition).

There is space to record scores for other players and may be used if applicable, although these scores will be ignored for handicapping purposes (they would require their own separate card to be submitted, as would the MARKER, if they wished their score to count towards handicap).

The card must be signed by both PLAYER A and MARKER.

Handicaps

The Index of a player is independent of course, and can be found on howdidido.com, the Club PSI screen or the MyEG Phone App.

The Course Handicap can be found using the Handicap Conversion Table, every Club should have one that is easily accessible. Course Handicap = Index x Slope / 113. In competitions, **Course handicap MUST be included on the Card as required by the Rules of Golf.**

The Playing Handicap depends on the format being played. The most common examples are:

Singles Strokeplay (Medal or Stableford): 95% of Course Handicap

Singles Match Play: 100% of Course Handicap

Fourball Match Play: 90% of Course Handicap

Although there is no obligation to include the Playing handicap on the scorecard for a competition, it is recommended it is added as it allows the player to work out their competition score. Either way, the software should ensure the correct Playing Handicap is used when publishing competition results.

If a player is simply handing cards in for initial handicap, then no handicaps need to be present on card. If a player is submitting a card for handicap in a General Play round, no handicaps are required on the card, although including the Handicap Index is recommended as it may help identify the player along with their name (in case members share the same name).

Total Scores

It is recommended that players work out their final scores, whether this be medal play or Stableford, as this assists checking the scores after the round. However, there is no penalty for not doing this, and the Committee will check the scores have been added correctly. However, the Player is responsible to ensure each individual Hole Score is correct and clear. It is not necessary to complete every hole (for the round to count towards handicap), and a - can be shown on card to indicate this. **It is recommended a player only considers quitting playing a hole once their score is likely to exceed double par, to ensure they do not pick up too early.**
