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Course Report

The course has been subject to topsy-turvey weather conditions throughout the past month. The course dried out really well in February but there has been excessive rainfall throughout March so far. On a positive note, the temperatures are increasing, so hopefully Spring is just around the corner! It has been very Spring-like today, so the course is beginning to dry out again. Thankfully the crow damage has generally continued to decline, and we are hopeful there will be a dramatic recovery once the weather improves.

We are currently overseeding and topdressing the tees, and preparing them for the season ahead, with a view to bringing them back into play by the 1st of April 2023. The Spring maintenance program is under way, but work has been delayed by the adverse weather conditions.

Club Captain, Paul Todd, who attended the association meeting has offered to pressure wash the patio.



Preferred lies

We aim to review the preferred lies ruling at the end of March, with the view to make a decision of how long this rule will be in play for. The maximum period will be until the end of April, but we will keep you informed with any decisions made. If you are not in the WhatsApp group and wish to be added, please let one of the management team know at the golf reception and we will add you in. The WhatsApp group is also useful for arranging social golf with members.

Handicaps

In October 2022 we announced in the Association report that in order to play in the three prestigious competitions: Charles Ottewell trophy, The Falcon Cup and the Club Championships, you must submit 3 scorecards towards your handicap index prior to the competition starting.

However, after recent discussions, it has been decided that to enter <u>ALL</u> club competitions from the 1st April 2023, regardless of the format, qualifying or non-qualifying, and whether it is individual; pairs; or teams of 3 or 4, you must submit/or have submitted three scorecards for handicap purposes since the 1st April 2022. This is applicable to <u>ALL</u> Welton Manor members. As stated in the October report, the Club Championships will still require 3 qualifying scorecards in addition to the 3 scorecards entered for handicap purposes.

This decision has been made following our recent Association meeting discussions on Wednesday 15th March and confirmed after Jacqui Brinicombe, Erol Palsay, John Lee and John Hussey attended the WHS Club Workshop for handicaps at Woodhall Spa, on Thursday 16th March to make for fairer competition, and for handicaps to be a true reflection of player ability. We encourage any players with less than 20 submitted scorecards to submit more to get an accurate reflection of your ability. If you are going to submit a scorecard for your handicap, you must register your intent to do so prior to the round on the My EG app, How Did I Do, or on the PSI in the clubhouse. You must have an attester/marker of your score who has played the same round with you and witness your score.

You can view your scorecard record on the My EG app (you will need your CDH number to register – please ask the management team if you don't know yours). If you are still unsure, please contact either Jacqui Brinicombe or Erol Palsay (contact details can be found on the last page). In addition, if you have any questions about the introduction of the rule in general, please contact the management team.

Club competitions

End of the winter league

The Winter league has proved very successful, with 20 golfers taking part across 4 leagues. John Hussey has done a fantastic job updating the league tables on a regular basis, and I have attached the most recent league tables to this report. If you have not completed your games, please finish these matches by the end March.

Start of the summer league

The Summer league will be starting on the 1st April and will run until the 30th September, and it is open to all members with a handicap. Entry into the league will be £5, and you will be placed in a league with members of similar a handicap. You will be responsible for organising your own games. The format will be a non-qualifying matchplay scored over holes 1-9 and 10-18, meaning if you lose the front 9 you can still win the back 9. The winners of each league will be presented with a trophy, and a fun final round day will take place. Entries close the 30th March so get your entries in as soon as possible – the entry sheet can be found on the main club competition noticeboard, alternatively you can email the management team and we can add you on.
